Italo is the first private Italian operator on the high-speed rail network. The current Italo train fleet consists of 25 state-of-the-art AGV 575 trains capable of traveling at very high speeds, up to 360 km/h, and 26 Italo EVO trains, an evolution of the "Pendolino" family, designed to travel at a maximum speed of 250 km/h, complying with the latest EU safety standards.

Since May 2023, Italo has acquired the private long-distance passenger transport company Itabus to offer intermodal train plus bus services with a single ticket and connections operated entirely by bus to connect all of Italy: major cities, tourist villages, and infrastructure hubs.

With its fleet, Italo offers journeys rich in entertainment experiences and personalized services, in maximum comfort, and designed for the diverse needs of every type of traveler.

There are three travel environments: Smart offers great quality at competitive prices. Prima Business is dedicated to those who seek comfort and attentive service while traveling. And then there is Club Executive: an exclusive travel environment for the most demanding travelers. Onboard the train, with free Internet connection in all environments, you can access the Italolive onboard portal via Wi-Fi, from which you can enjoy various entertainment content such as free movies, newspapers, digital books, and much more. The entertainment continues in the Cinema carriage, which offers a different themed schedule each month with a selection of the best films.
