Diego Della Valle was born in Casette D'Ete di S. Elpidio a Mare on 30 December 1953.

After studying law in Bologna and a period of work in the United States, he joined the family business in 1975, helping his father run the company and where he was able to gain deeper knowledge of high quality production techniques.

He played a leading role in defining the business strategies and creating the brands that distinguished the Company's products, giving way to the development of an innovative marketing plan, which became an example and was followed by many in the high quality industry.

In October 2000, he was appointed Chairman and Managing Director of the new group, Tod's SpA, listed on the Milan stock exchange, and which today is a world leader in the luxury accessories sector, with the brands Tod's, Hogan, Fay and Roger Vivier.

In 1996 he was nominated Knight of Labour. In 2000 he received an honorary degree in Business and Economics from the University of Ancona and in 2017 an honorary Master's Degree in Economics and Management from the University of Sannio.

He has been a Board member of companies such as Ferrari and Assicurazioni Generali. He currently holds the same office in LVMH, a world leader in the luxury industry and RCS.

He is also a shareholder, through family-owned financial companies together with his brother Andrea, of Tod's, RCS, Piaggio, Cinecittà, Fondo Charme, NTV (Nuovo Trasporto Viaggiatori), Fondazione Umberto Veronesi and of the football team ACF Fiorentina.

Diego Della Valle is member of the Umberto Veronesi Foundation Committee and Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Della Valle Non-Profit Foundation.
